Her artwork in pastel, watercolor, oil, acrylic, mixed media, and soapstone sculpture has been exhibited in galleries and juried art exhibits throughout New England, and many pieces are in private collections nationally and internationally. Presently Molly is represented at Cooper and Smith Gallery, Essex, Connecticut, and in regional exhibits such as the Shoreline ArtsTrail, New Haven Paint and Clay Club, Lyme Art Association, Guilford Art League, Connecticut Women Artist, Madison Art League, and Lyme Art Association .

Throughout her career Molly has been active in national and local art education organizations and has exhibited and contributed her artwork to various fundraisers such as New Haven Arts Council, Guilford Arts Center, Guilford Women and Family Life Center, Guilford Hyland House Fundraiser, and Dan Cosgrove Animal Shelter Fundraiser.
